Rabbi's Words



This tends to be a favorite time of year for me in many regards. We get the last heat-waves of the summer, as I write this today, it's a balmy 108 degrees in the far west San Fernando Valley. But even as the heat beats down, August is winding down and with it summer. Labor Day looms before us and schools have started again. Is it just me, or do the young people go back earlier to school than ever? Major League Baseball is down to its last 30 or so games. Barring the strange and unusual (given its the Dodgers, both are possible), the boys in Blue, should make the playoffs in quest of a rare 3-peat.

On the other side of the coin, it is for a rabbi, a crazy time of year. Talking to my rabbinic colleagues, looking at various rabbinical list-serves, the big topics are "what are you talking about for the High Holidays" and "are you done"? One can see from the calendar included in this month's Migdalar, with Rosh Hashanah, then Yom Kippur and then Sukkot, September and Tishrei are a very busy month. A teaching I have that I'll share over and over, because it's so important is, 'what are the 2 hardest things to say to someone and mean'?? The answers are: **I love you and I'm sorry.** Yom Kippur is not so much about making amends with G!d. In so many ways, that's actually easy. The doorway to G!d is always open and he is always ready to receive us. What is hard is making amends with those in our lives. It is hard to turn to a loved one and say, "I'm

sorry. I transgressed, I missed the mark and I'm sorry. Can you forgive me"? And let's be honest, as hard as it is to ask for forgiveness, granting it and meaning it, are just as hard. In my thinking, this is why Yom Kippur is given to us as a blessing. The holy-day has been granted us to give us space to ask for and to receive forgiveness. Some of the hardest tasks in the human experience. Unless it's absolutely necessary, asking for forgiveness via Text or Email hit me as misguided. It is best to do so in person or at least on the phone. A posting on Social Media asking for forgiveness is also misguided and at best impersonal. As we enter the season of repentance, let's all work at finding those we need to address and make our best efforts at making amends.

PROJECT ISAIAH

“There’s nothing in this house to eat!” We heard that a lot when the kids were growing up. The solution was simple. Get in the car and go to the store. That’s not an option for one in four families in Ventura County. They face food insecurity. Hunger.

Food Share Ventura works to fill that immediate need. Each year they provide meals to 250,000 people with the help of 200 partner organizations and 2,000 volunteers.

There are many ways to support Food Share’s work. We can volunteer packing produce, driving supermarket routes, inspecting donations, or filling emergency boxes.

If that’s not possible, we can bring non-perishable food to CAH to be picked up by Food Share after the High Holidays. We have bags with lists of needed supplies to be filled.

Our Jewish tradition admonishes us to *Tikkun Olam*. Project Isaiah answers that call, and as we do, we remember the guidance from Rabbi Tarfon, Pirkei Avot, 2:21:

“It is not your responsibility to finish the work of perfecting the world, but neither are you free to desist from it either.”

Soda cans are recyclable. Plastic water bottles, both plain and flavored can be recycled. From the small 4 ounce to the large half gallon bottles can bring money in to CAH.

If you think a few cents doesn't matter, I can tell you a small income on a regular basis adds up. Since we started in 2014 CAH has earned \$ 1,173.32. You can bring the recycles to services or you can save them in 13 or 33 gallon bags and I will be happy to pick them up.

There are lots of holiday parties coming up between now and New Years Eve. You might ask neighbors to save them.

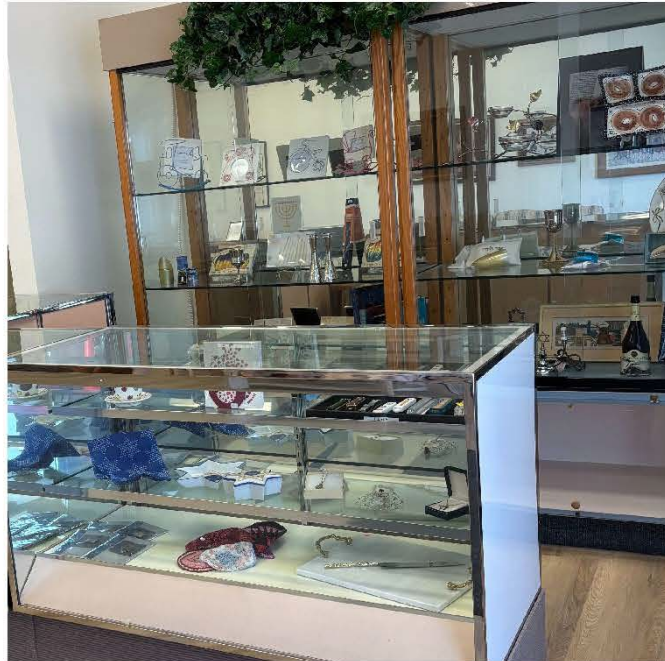
